One of the great things about Health Partners Foundation is that when transitions and challenges arise, we embrace them as new opportunities to build toward a greater tomorrow. As our community faced an unprecedented year in 2020, we were able to pivot and devote our energy and resources to providing aid to community members who needed it most.

Here are a few highlights:

- In partnership with HPP, donated \$275,000 to organizations addressing food insecurity and COVID-19 relief
- Distributed 10,000 PPE items
- Donated \$20,000 to HPP owner hospitals in support of emergency relief efforts for employees
- Provided food for 950 families
- Recognized 600 essential hospital workers
- Recognized 1025 essential workers at three federally qualified health centers

Last year was also an exciting time for HPF as we welcomed a new board chair, Joe Dodi, and a new treasurer, Laura Martin. We extended our heartfelt gratitude to Michelle Davidson, who chaired the Board with thoughtfulness and ingenuity for two years. 



During an unprecedented year for our community, our family of volunteers, donors and partners came together to meet crucial needs across the community focusing on the following areas of relief:
